This information sheet will give you a better understanding of the City's snow removal procedures.

When do the City crews start snow plowing the streets? 3" or greater of snow build-up

When is my street going to be plowed? Use the City website's map to view all the City streets and the priority for snow removal. Depending on the severity of the storm, the City reserves the right to leave lower priority streets (non-arterial) untouched for up to 72 hours following the storm in order to facilitate cleanup in priority areas.

Which side of the street do I park my car during a snow condition? The City of Hood River Ordinance allows parking on the south and west sides of the street. This will allow City crews to clear the snow quickly and efficiently.

If I live on a parking restriction route where can I park my car? The City of Hood River Ordinance states if you live on a Downtown primary street there is NO parking on either side of the street between 3 a.m. and 6 a.m. or if you live on a Heights primary street there is NO parking on either side of the street between 12 a.m. and 6 a.m.

What will happen if my vehicle is parked in the wrong area during a snow condition? The City of Hood River Ordinance states your vehicle will be taken into custody and removed from its location at the owner's expense.

Who is responsible to remove snow and ice from sidewalks and around fire hydrants? It is the responsibility of both the tenant and the owner of the property. Sidewalk snow removal should be taken care of within 48 hours of the snowfall depending on the severity of the storm.

Where is the best place to pile my snow? Snow must be placed in the yard area and not near the curb. This will allow the storm drains to remain open. Do NOT place snow or ice in the street to melt, or for removal by the plows. This impedes the cleanup process and creates a driving hazard.
