

Come into compliance for RRP by attending an 8-hour renovator initial training.

- The trainer will give you the “renovator certification.”

At any time you can apply for your “Certified Lead-Based Paint Renovation Contractor (LBPR) License”

- Since you are registered as a business through CCB you will need to get your “LBPR License” through CCB.
- CCB will not allow you to apply for the RRP firm certification until after you have received your “renovator certification.”
